The “Enrichment” of the Fourth Degree

During our recent Christmas Leadership Dinner, Church Director Dcn. Wayne Slomiany challenged me to come up with a theme for this newsletter, so I posed the following question. “How has your involvement in the 4th degree enriched your life in 2021?” This is my personal response to that question.

The last six months have been remarkable to me, as many events have provided me with the opportunity to be on the road to meet most of you as the leadership nucleus of Michigan District 2 throughout the Lansing and Kalamazoo Dioceses. For me, these personal encounters have been some of the most enriching parts of my life during the past six months; including our many Officer Installations, District meetings, and special events. You are all very special to me.



Of course our most significant event was the 83rd Exemplification of Michigan District 2 at the Community of St. Jude in Dewitt. There, we were able to bring in 25 new Sir Knights throughout the District in the first live exemplification for me as the Master of the District. (We held three “virtual” exemplifications in my first year). On October 23, 2021, we honored Former Master David A. Buick, and put our leadership team to the test to see how seamlessly everyone was able to work together to create a successful event; and it was a rousing success! Special thanks goes out to District Friars Fr. Brian Lenz and Fr. Bob Creagan, St. Jude Pastor Fr. David Speicher, FN Paul Koleda and his team from St. Francis Assembly #2982, the District leadership team, the District Degree team led by David Lennemann, and Lady Denise Yekulis and all of the wives and ladies who put on a great Ladies program at the Memorial Building.

Along with the 83rd Exemplification, there was: The 50th Anniversary Celebration of the Kalamazoo Diocese at St. Augustine Cathedral, Vocations Night with the Lansing Lugnuts, the Ox Roast Parade in Dewitt, all of the Officer Installations in the Lansing and Kalamazoo Dioceses, and the Dedication Mass with Bishop Paul Bradley in Centreville. We said goodbye to WWII Pearl Harbor survivor Dick Thelen on September 18th and Former District 2 Master Glenn Barry on October 12th. Finally, another WWII Hero Corporal Andrew Pellerito was laid to rest on November 30, 2021 at the Ft. Custer National Cemetery with a combined Honor Guard from Michigan Districts 1, 2 and 4.

What have been our successes since last summer? Let’s start with Operation Patriotism. With your consent at our last District meeting, we allocated \$4,000 to three different programs in November 2021. The VA Hospital in Ann Arbor received \$1500 for their “Fisher House” that was doubled as part of a matching grant; the VA Hospital in Battle Creek received \$1500 for three veteran’s accounts that care for Personal Care, Recreation and the Remember a Vet fund; and the New Hope Center (Holy Cross Services) in Lansing received \$1,000 for their Homeless Vet Program. The check presentations can be seen on the MI District 2 website under “Knights in Action.”

Before going to the seminary in 1979, my local council had a special First Degree ceremony for me. To be a Fourth Degree member is an additional privilege and duty to God, Church and Country.

Enriching Our Assembly & Communities

Our Worthy District Master SK Joseph Yekulis asked if I would become his Executive Assistant for the District. Agreeing to do so has provided me a more detailed view of ongoing efforts within the district and afforded me the opportunity to meet and get to know many more of my Brother Sir Knights in Michigan District II. Participating in zoom calls, live meetings, and our recent live 83rd Exemplification, with undoubtedly the best exemplification team ever, has been truly a worthwhile experience.

Assembly #510's ongoing efforts to support our veterans in need required us to initiate several new programs due to large fundraising gatherings being unable to take place. Our Assembly launched a Christmas Card fundraiser campaign which allowed us to maintain funding which supported our ongoing Wrap-A-Vet campaign and initiate an entirely new Vets-In-Need financial support program with the V.A. hospitals in Ann Arbor and Saginaw. We have also continued to support the Wounded Warriors Program, Wreaths Across America, and recently added the Tunnel to Towers to our repertoire.

Working with the Military Arch Dioceses of Washington D.C., we have provided several chalices in the names of deceased members of our Assembly to be provided to active-duty Catholic Chaplains for their use around the world. We have also engaged our Assembly in the support of the Military Chaplain's Scholarship Fund. Much of these efforts have aided our Assembly #510 in being selected as a Star Assembly twice in the past 3 years as well as continuing to secure new members.

Our most recent undertaking has been in support of our District II Master SK Joseph Yekulis initiative to "Restore the Corps!" As a result, after prayerful thought and consideration, I purchased the new uniform and our Assembly then voted unanimously to financially aid those who would once again become active members of our Color Corps. At this time, at least 12 members have stepped forward and secured the uniform, allowing our Assembly to return to being an active Color Corps for funerals, Corporate Communion, and other church-based functions and celebrations.

On January 12th, a check for \$1750 was sent to Supreme to support this important mission. Thank you all for your help with this project, along with those of you who sent in additional funds from your own Assemblies.

Now let's talk about our future goals for the rest of this fraternal year.

Starting with the month of January, your Assembly Fraternal Surveys are due to Supreme on January 31, 2022.

I will be convening our next **MI District 2 Meeting on Saturday March 5, 2022** from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Our Lady of Fatima Parish in Michigan Center (south of Jackson) where we have held several of our meetings in the past. (Doors open at 8:30 a.m.). We will use this as an opportunity to review our recruitment efforts for the next exemplification and to discuss the remaining priorities of this fraternal year. This meeting is mandatory for all Navigators, and should include your Comptrollers and CC Commanders along with any other leadership you would like to bring along. (Enjoy the smell of a fresh fish fry from the night before).

We will be taking a poll of the number of members in each assembly's color corps, and ask what you are doing to successfully engage more members. Remember that our mission this term is to "Restore the Corps."

If your goal is to make "Star Assembly" this fraternal year, we will review current membership status and the criteria for continued success.

This meeting will be considered our Biennial Meeting as required under Supreme Bylaw Article V, Section 14 (c).


The 84th Exemplification of Michigan District 2 is taking place in the Kalamazoo Diocese at St. Philip parish and high school in downtown Battle Creek. The current Romanesque structure was built in 1929 after the original church was burned down in a fire in 1928. Adjoining the Church is St. Philip High School, where the Fourth Degree Exemplification and Ladies Program will take place, and we will celebrate Mass in the Church. Most importantly, our special honoree will be Very Rev. Robert Creagan, who has been the K of C Diocesan Chaplain and Friar of Kalamazoo for many years. We hope we can honor him with at least 50 to 100 new Sir Knights this spring, so please do your part and start recruiting as soon as possible. The host hotel will be the Fairfield Inn and Suites on the SW side of Battle Creek on the western edge of town off I-94.

Finally, we were honored to be present for the vigil service and Mass for Fr. David Hudgins of St. Joseph Shrine in the Irish Hills on January 7th – 8th. Fr. David was a Fourth Degree member, and was killed in a tragic traffic crash on US-127 on the morning of January 3rd. With St. Michael the Archangel Assembly #1969 down to only three honor guard members, many assemblies responded to the call for assistance, and there were 16 members present for the Friday night vigil service, and 21 answered the call to assist at the funeral service held at St. Mary Cathedral in Lansing on Saturday morning with Bishop Earl Boyea as celebrant.

When we remember the image of one lonely string during the Second Degree held together by many fibers to create an unbreakable cable, it provides us with a great lesson on unity. As Brother Sir Knights, we must band together to support one another and create a unified force as part of the Lord's Holy vision for the Knights of Columbus.




